Federal Funding Overview

The Livermore Amador Valley Transit Authority (LAVTA) is the provider of the Wheels fixed bus and paratransit service in the Tri Valley area. LAVTA was founded in 1985 by the cities of Dublin, Livermore and Pleasanton and Alameda County to serve the community's transit needs and interests. LAVTA's mission is to provide equal access to a variety of safe, customer oriented, reliable, and affordable public transportation choices, increasing the mobility and improving the quality of life of those who live, work in or visit the Tri Valley.

Current Funding:

- 1) Capital - Bus Procurements – 20 delivering in 2016 – Total: \$30 million
20 delivering in 2017
- 2) Operating – ParaTaxi Service – New Freedom Funds – 50% of total service
- 3) Operating – ADA Operations - \$300,000
- 4) Operating – Route 14 – Lifeline/Job Access Reverse Commute Funds- \$129,000/2 years
- 5) Operating – 5304 Funds – Part-Time Planning Intern position

If Eliminated:

- 1) Bus Procurements - \$30 million to be covered by future operating monies
- 2) ParaTaxi Service – 50% share to be covered by future operating monies
- 3) ADA Operations - \$300,000 to be covered by future operating monies
- 4) Route 14 – Service cut or to be covered by future operating monies
- 5) Part-Time Planning Intern position – Position eliminated.

Net Results:

-Severe cuts in Transit Service to Dublin, Livermore and Pleasanton

-20% reduction in LAVTA Workforce
