

OBAG 3 References for Disproportionately Impacted Communities

The OBAG 3 County & Local Program Call for Projects Guidelines (adopted in March 2022 as Appendix A-1 to MTC Resolution No. 4505) prioritize project applications with demonstrated public support from communities disproportionately impacted by past discriminatory practices, including redlining, racial covenants, urban renewal, and highway construction that divided low-income and communities of color.
